

## 2021 Oklahoma Youth Risk Behavior Survey: Sexual Behaviors

The Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS), conducted every two years by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and Oklahoma State Department of Health, monitors priority health risk behaviors that contribute to the leading causes of death, disability and social problems among youth. Data was collected from 1,690 Oklahoma public school students in grades 9- 12 during the 2021 fall semester. (NA = not asked) CDC will release the 2021 YRBS national results in early 2023.
