<u>Tulsa metro area</u>: The 706 teen births in the eight metro area counties totaled one-fourth (25%) of all births in the state: Tulsa (502), Creek (41), Rogers (43), Wagoner (31), Washington (26), Okmulgee (28), Osage (22) and Pawnee (13).

<u>For ages 20-24</u>: There were 1,769 births, with a rate of 78.9. Over one in five (380, 21%) had not graduated from high school when they gave birth. Over seven out of 10 (73%) births were paid by Medicaid (1,295); almost half were subsequent births (798, 45%); and seven of 10 mothers (1,272, 72%) were unmarried.
